Chile started the qualifiers for the next South American Championship to be hosted by Cofradía Nautica del Pacífico in Algarrobo, Chile from December 7-12, 2021.

On October 9-10, the Chilean J/70 fleet had the first of two qualifier days with 20 boats at the starting line. The last four boats will not qualify and will be available for charter during the event.





Conditions were very good with winds of 15-24 knots on Saturday and from 13-20 knots on Sunday. Some crews with few hours of sailing in the last year did their best to succeed in these tough conditions. Wind, but also waves, coming both from the south helped the boats to surf longer than usual, especially on starboard with speed over 18 knots.

# Proposed Class Rules Changes

The International Technical Committee has proposed a set of Class Rules changes for 2022. Most of these changes are either minor wording changes that have been identified over the past two years as areas for clarification, or non-substantive changes that move rules from the J/70 Building Specification (a J/Boats document) into the J/70 Class Rules. None of the proposed 2022 changes will alter the way that J/70s are sailed.

The text of the 2022 Rules Change proposals can be found at the International J/70 Class Association website (http://j70ica.org/class-office-rules/). Under the Class' bylaws, they will be voted on at the Annual General Meeting on December 8, 2021, and thereafter be submitted for approval by World Sailing. I expect they will go into effect in early 2022.

# A COUPLE OF THE HIGHLIGHTS OF THE PROPOSALS ARE:

We propose that the headsail halyard fine-tune purchase may be increased to as much as 8:1. This increase from the current 4:1 purchase limit will make sailing the boat easier for smaller teams, especially as new generations of headsails require more frequent adjustments to the halyard for optimal performance.

We propose to allow the addition of a second cam cleat to the gennaker halyard system. It is not uncommon in windy conditions to hear reports of gennaker halyards "slipping" or "releasing" from the cam cleat spontaneously. This is obviously less than pleasant to experience, and other keelboat classes have effectively addressed this concern by allowing a second cam cleat to be installed (usually oriented at 90° from the primary cam cleat).

Again, most of the rest of the changes—there are 16 in all—are alterations to provide more consistency and clarity and to better align the Class Rules with the J/70 Building Specification, the Racing Rules of Sailing, the Equipment Rules of Sailing, and with existing Class intent and practice.

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# PREPARING FOR THE 2022 J/70 WORLDS

In 2022, the European Championship in Hyeres, Southern France will be followed by the World Championship in Monaco, bringing what is expected to be many J/70s to the area. The Yacht Club de Monaco is hoping for a fleet of 120 boats, and we are expecting approximately 90 boats in Hyeres. Here are a few thoughts on these two Championship regattas.

# PREPARING FOR TWO EVENTS IN VENUES WITH DIFFERENT WEATHER PATTERNS AND CONDITIONS

Hyeres is known for its mistral in a sheltered bay, which means fast races on flat sea. Monaco is better known for light wind and choppy sea. Two very different sets of sailing skills are required for these venues. The European Championship is in mid-September, which makes the mistral likely to happen; or if the mistral is not present, a good seabreeze will save the day. There is more uncertainty about Monaco as it will take place mid-October when strong easterly breezes can raise rather high seas with a short wave period. Pretty much anything can happen in these conditions, from a rodeo ride to flat sea and 15 knot southwesterly wind. The good thing about both venues is that there will be little traffic from other recreational vessels, which can be upsetting when racing.

To prepare for Europeans, come and sail during the winter at the Yacht Club de Monaco. It hosts one event a month (except in January), leading up to the Primo Cup the first weekend of March. Some of the best Italian teams compete in these regattas. Over the course of four events, you'll have plenty of opportunities to get your marks in this rather tricky spot.

To be the best at Hyeres, training in strong gusty wind will be useful. Although Garda Lake is freshwater, this is still the best place to train in strong reliable wind. Going to Hyeres in early spring will also provide enough mistral time to get a feel for it. The complication of training here is that the wind may be too strong, far above Class limit. There is also plenty of reading to do about past events and conditions in Hyeres, as the best dinghy sailors sail the SOF (Semaine Olympique Française) every year.

#### **RIG TUNING IN MONACO AND HYERES**

Short, choppy sea in Monaco makes it difficult to get the boat going. You often need to sail one step lower than what you would normally sail, given the wind strength. Be dynamic with your mainsheet trim to help keep you powered up and punching through the chop. Downwind, it can be hard to stabilize the asymmetric spinnaker, and it will take some practice to find the right angle.

Make sure to get out on the water ahead of racing to get a feel for Monaco's conditions.

Hyeres should be true to the tuning guide. It is known for prime racing conditions, so expect to race the full schedule. This will test your stamina, so it will be important to rest properly, avoid getting sunburned and keep your hands in good conditions.

For all the racing coming up this season, you'll need a good set of all-around sails. You'll want to be comfortable with your sails so you can adapt quickly to any condition. The Quantum Sails J/70 team of experts,

including Travis Odenbach, Victor Marino, Carlo Fracassoli and Fernando Sallent, has worked hard to develop a reliable set of sails for this Class. We used Quantum Sails last season leading up to the European Championship in Copenhagen, and they paid off!
