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Unusual conditions for Lake Garda dictated the fate of the last two days of the J/70 Corinthian World Cup which, after the six races held in the first two days, came to an end on 4 June with a "double" no-race due

to lack of wind. At the end of the series, also considering the discard of the worst result, the winner of the first J/70 Corinthian World Cup in history is Gianfranco Noè's *White Hawk*. The crew of the Italian owner, already

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the Corinthian World Champion in Porto Cervo 2017, put the seal on the title thanks to a scoreline which, out of the six races, counted two bullets, a second and a third place.

"Winning a regatta in which you challenge yourself with 75 other crews is always a great emotion; being able to do it in the first edition of an event of this magnitude is a double reason for pride. The J/70 Corinthian World Cup was the most ambitious event of this season for *White Hawk*. We arrived with high expectations, and we achieved this victory. Thanks to my crew, which is a real group of friends who have been sharing this passion for years between work, study and all

personal commitments, according to the true Corinthian spirit. Are we going to defend the Corinthian World Cup next year in Denmark? Who knows, probably!" commented Noè.

On the podium in second place was *Irrational Exuberance* from Estonia of Tonu Toniste, 11 points behind *White Hawk*. The bronze medal went to the Australian crew of *Celestial*, led by Sam Haynes. The top five was completed







by *Let It Be* by the Spanish Marcelo Baltzer Foucher and *Three Musketeers* from Brazil, led by Alberto Guarischi.

Sofia Giondi won the 'First Women Helm' trophy, and *Moore DRV* received the award for the best Under 25 crew, led by Sander Jongenelen. The crews of *Mr Henri* (winners in the Mixed Plus Division), *Happyyachting. com* (for their success in the Garmin Cup) and *White Hawk* again for the Alphazer EnergyStart Trophy were also awarded.

"Thanks from the J/70 Italian Class to all those who made possible the organization and success of this spectacular event. First of all to the International Class, which has chosen to rely on us for the first edition of an event of this caliber, and then to Fraglia Vela Riva, a solid and indispensable partner for such occasions," stated Federico Siragna, President of J/70 Italian Class.

DAY ONE RECAP: The event kicked off 1 June, attracting 75 crews representing 20 nations (Australia, Belgium, Brazil, Denmark, Estonia, France, Germany, Great Britain, Ireland, Italy, Mexico, Monaco, Netherlands, Poland, Spain, Sweden, Switzerland, Turkey, Uruguay and the United States) to the starting line. Participants completed three dynamic races. *Calypso Plastic Pledge* by Jonathan Calascione who, thanks to the placements scored in the first races of the series (6-3-3), solidly gained the top of

was *Dads 'N' Lads* by Tim Simpson & Ole Bettum (2-27-13). From the fifth to seventh positions, we found equal points (47) for the Brazilian entry *To Nessa*, the Dutch of *Jello* and the Australians of *Celestial*. "We are excited about this start, but the road is still long and the fleet competitive and very fierce so no choice is obvious and every point important. Thanks to the organizers for being able to bring such a beautiful Corinthian fleet from all over the world back to the starting line!" commented Calscione.





DAY TWO RECAP: With a Southern wind that was gradually decreasing during the afternoon, the fleet was still able to complete three races as scheduled. Three different winners claimed victory: the Dutch entry *Mr Henri* scored the bullet in the first race, the Brazilian *Three Musketeers* in the second and American *Furio* in the third/last race of the day. The most consistent boat of the day was *Happyyachting.com* of the Swedish Pär Svärdson who, with scorings of 7-5-4, won the Garmin Cup, awarded to the best boat in the day of Friday. Thanks to the collaboration between the J/70 Italian Class and Garmin Marine Italy, the crew of *Happyyachting.com* received a Garmin Quatix 7 smartwatch. Friday's balanced races brought about many changes in the standings, where the new leader was Noè's *White Hawk* (20-2-3 Friday). The Estonian entry of the Toniste brothers was in second place, 11 points behind *White Hawk*. Third place was the Australian crew of *Celestial*, while the Spanish *Let it Be* and the Brazilians of *Three Musketeers* completed the top five.







DAY THREE RECAP:

The warm Ora wind that accompanied the first two days didn't fill in, leaving the fleet waiting in vain for its arrival. After a couple of hours, the Race Committee chaired by Giancarlo Crevatin decided to send crews back to their moorings.

Sacketts Top J/70 Corinthian US National Championship

The Sackett family from Cleveland, Ohio can start planning their trip to Real Club Nautico de Palma in Spain for the 2024 J/70 World Championship. Father and son skippers Tod and Lee Sackett finished first and second, following a one-point difference to decide the J/70 Corinthian US National Championship, securing berths for next year's premiere J/70 event. Tod Sackett's *FM* started the final day in fourth place overall but racked up scores of 2,1,3 to claim the title with 29 points. The *FM* crew included Abie Griggs, Jeff Haase and Ian Moran.

Lee Sackett & Dave Kerr on *USA1516* (winners of the previous two Corinthian US National Championships) posted two bullets on the final day but finished just one point shy of the victory. Places three through five were a



nailbiter, with Mike Kirkman's *Hot Ticket* eking out third place on the tiebreaker with Sean O'Brien's *McFly*. David Jannetti's *Very Odd* was only another notch back for fifth place. Twenty-one boats competed at Bayview Yacht Club in Detroit, Michigan from August 4-6, with daily coaching from Nick Turney. A full slate of nine races was completed. Following a front that passed through overnight, conditions on Lake Saint Clair







amped up to 12-16 knots Sunday. Michael Booker on *USA1516* summarized, "It was a well-run event in a wide range of conditions and great competition!"

DAY ONE RECAP: O'Brien's *McFly* jumped out to the early advantage, including a bullet in Friday's third and final race for 9 net points. Conditions saw warm summer temperatures and winds that began around 6 knots and improved to 10 throughout the day. Lee Sackett/Kerr on *USA1516* stood in the runnerup position with 10 points, ahead of David Jannetti's *Very Odd* with 14 points. Jannetti kicked off the Championship with a victory



in a shifty race, chased by Sam Sansome's Haddock and Thomas Ritter's Tramp. USA1516 followed with line honors in steadying breeze in race two, as O'Brien's



McFly and Tod Sackett's *FM* got in on the action. O'Brien closed the day successfully, along with Kirkman's *Hot Ticket* and Brian Williams' *Afterberner*.

DAY TWO RECAP: Another three races were recorded Saturday, bringing the total to six and initiating the discard race. O'Brien's *McFly* stayed consistent to hold the lead with 13 net points, dropping an eighth in race five. Kirkman's Hot Ticket launched up the leaderboard with two bullets for the second position at 19 net points. Both Sacketts stayed in the hunt: Lee Sackett/ Kerr on USA1516 in third (22 points) and Tod Sackett's FM only another notch back. Light breeze at 5-7 knots greeted competitors with continued warm temperatures and hazy skies. Kirkman's Hot Ticket racked up their first victory in race four, trailed by O'Brien's *McFly* and Tod Sackett's FM. Following Kirkman in the next contest was the Lee Sackett/Kerr group on USA1516 and Calliston Racing's *Hestia*. In race six, Hanson Bratton's T2, O'Brien and Todd Jenner's Tea Dance Snake led the fleet to the dock for the day's debrief.

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Clinicas W Wins the J/70 National Ranking

The Spanish J/70 Class comes to the end of its racing season, and after celebrating the cup and the championship of Spain, the Spanish association of owners published the national ranking in July. There has been a total of 30 boats that have participated throughout the year, both in the local regattas held in Barcelona, Vigo and Palma de Mallorca, as well as in the two national events. The Mediterranean fleet has haggled in the Barcelona Winter Series, the J/70 Spring Mediterranean Series (held in Barcelona and Palma de Mallorca) Conde Godó Trophy, while the Atlantic fleet sailed the Villalia Winter Series, Villalia Spring Series and the Galician J/70 Championship. And

both fleets coincided first in the Spanish Cup played in May in Barcelona and then on the island of La Toja last June during the Spanish Championship.

TWO NATIONAL EVENTS TO MAKE THE RANKING

For the first time, this year the national ranking of the J/70 Class has been formed with the results of the two national events. Each competition had a different weighting, being 40% in the Spanish Cup and 60% in the championship. Thanks to having finished in fourth position in the Spanish Cup and second in the Spanish Championship, the canaries of the *Clínicas W* have been

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proclaimed champions of the national ranking representing RCN de Gran Canaria, RCN Arrecife and RCN Barcelona. The second place has been for Marnatura 1 of the Galician Luis Bugallo of RCN Vigo, thanks to two thirds in both events. The third box of the podium is occupied by *Tenaz* of Pablo Garriga (RCN de Barcelona) after his second place in the Spanish Cup and a fourth in the championship. Hang Ten by Jorge Martínez Doreste, did not have such good fortune in Barcelona and finished in seventh place, and after winning the title of champions of Spain, they have an overall score that places them in fourth place in the ranking. And the top five of the ranking closes with the team Noticia of Luis Martín Cabiedes (RCN Barcelona) after a sixth and a fifth.

It is important to note that following the regulations of the International Class J/70, the national rankings of each country refer to

the skippers and not to the boats or teams. That is, who is classified is the skipper, and it is mandatory to haggle in both qualifying events. Also, in Spain a rule was added that in each boat at least two crew members including the skipper had to be kept in the two events.

QUALIFIED FOR THE 2024 WORLD CHAMPIONSHIP

The 2023 ranking enables the top six finishers to participate in the World Championship to be held next year in Palma de Mallorca during the month of September. Due to the merits achieved in previous international championships by Luis Bugallo and Pichu Torcida, these skippers already have their place for the World Championship in Palma, with which they run place and at the moment it will be the first seven classified who have the option of navigating

the 2024 World Championship representing our country. But they will not be the only Spaniards because the Real Club Náutico de Palma, as an organizing club, has another four places that will be distributed according to their criteria, starting with the Mallorcan teams such as *Nautia Yacht Insurance* by Miquel Coll, *Patakin* by Luis Albert and *Balearia* by María Bover. At the time the writing of this news was closed, it was not yet known who would be the holder of the last place at stake, but it will be communicated during this summer.

TROPHY PRESENTATION DURING THE COPA DEL REY MAPFRE

The J/70 Class and the top 10 finishers in the ranking had their moment of glory during the Copa del Rey Mapfre, a regatta in which several J/70 teams participated. The RCN de Palma as the organizing club of the next World Cup and as support to the Class coordinated together with the National Class an awards ceremony of the top ten of the ranking. Each winning team will also have a commemorative trophy with an important gift donated by the sponsors and collaborators of the J/70 Class in Spain. The teams:

- 4th Hang Ten, Jorge Martínez Doreste: (7°x0,4 + 1°x0,6) = 3,4 points

- **5**th **Noticia**, Luis M. Cabiedes: (6°x0,4 + 5°x0,6) = 5,4 points
- $6^{\text{th}} Abril Rojo$, Jorge Pérez Canal: (8°x0,4 + 8°x0,6) = 8 points
- 7th Abril Verde, Luis Pérez Canal: (11°x0,4 + 9°x0,6) = 9,8 points
- 8th Let it be, Juan Calvo: (12°x0,4 + 6°x0,6) = 3,4 points = 10,8 points
- 9th Pazo de Cea, Javier Porto:
 (9°x0,4 + 14°x0,6) = 12 points
- 10th Seneca SW, Willy Alonso: (14°x0,4 + 11°x0,6) = 12,2 points

And the sponsoring brands: North Sails Spain, Villalia, Garmin, Nautia Yacht Service, Ratsey & Lapthorn, Oscar Trives nautical solutions, Rigger Workshop, Bodegas Can Marlés and Aceites Abril.

CHANGES FOR NEXT SEASON

Looking ahead to next year, the national classification system of the J/70 Class will evolve to be fairer. And instead of using the final result obtained by each skipper in the two national competitions, the results obtained in all the disputed rounds will be used. In addition, the weighting applied this year will be abolished, and each regatta will have the same value. In addition, the same discards that have been applied in each championship will be applied. And those skippers who do not participate in an event will accumulate the score of the last classified plus one point. In this way, maximum participation in both the Spanish Cup and the Championship continues to be encouraged and becomes more attractive since in this Class there is a lot of equality between the first classified.

The Technical Committee put forth Rules proposals to the Executive Committee, and they were endorsed and distributed to all National Class Associations to review and report back. If approved by the World Council, they will be submitted to World Sailing so they can be confirmed for use in January 2024. The Rules proposals are below for you to see:

1. AMENDMENT

C.8 HULL APPENDAGES

C.8.1 MODIFICATIONS, MAINTENANCE AND REPAIR

The following is permitted without the approval of the ICA's Technical Committee under E.2.2:

(a) The **hull appendages** may be lightly sanded for the purpose of applying anti-foul paint. If an epoxy barrier coat is applied, then anti-foul shall also be applied.

Amend to Read:

C.8 HULL APPENDAGES

C.8.1 MODIFICATIONS, MAINTENANCE AND REPAIR

The following is permitted without the approval of the ICA's Technical Committee under E.2.2:

(a) The **hull appendages** may be lightly sanded for the purpose of applying *epoxy and/or* anti-foul paint. If an epoxy

barrier coat is applied *alone, it must be white in color*, then anti-foul shall also be applied. **EXPLANATION:**

This amendment changes the requirement for bottom paint if an epoxy is applied to keel and rudder. This allows for repairs at a lower cost than trying to repair the gel coat on both keel and rudder.

3. AMENDMENT Old:

C.1.1 Rules

(a) The ERS Part I – Use of Equipment shall apply.

(b) RRS 42.3(c) is modified to read "When surfing (rapidly accelerating down the front of a wave) or planing is possible, the main and jib may be pulled in only once for each wave or gust of wind, but the gennaker sheet may be played without restriction."

Amend to Read:

C.1.1 Rules (a) The ERS Part I – Use of Equipment shall apply.

(b) RRS 42.3(c) is modified to read "When surfing (rapidly accelerating down the front of a wave) or planing is possible, to initiate surfing or planing, the main and jib may be pulled in only once for each wave or gust of wind, but the gennaker sheet may be played without restriction." **EXPLANATION:**

Change is to better clarify the CR C.1.1 (b).

4. AMENDMENT

CR Amend to Read: I.14 OSCAR FLAG

The change to RRS 42.3(c) described in Class rule C.1.1 (b) is only in effect when the Race Committee displays the code flag Oscar. **EXPLANATION:**

This new Class Rule allows the Race Committee to better control the additional gennaker pumping described in C.1.1 (b).

5. AMENDMENT

CR Amend to Read: I.10 MIXED-PLUS DIVISION

Regatta organizers will present awards for a Mixed-Plus division. To be considered as a Mixed-Plus team, Class Rule C.3 is modified so the **crew** shall consist of 4 or more persons and contain no more than two (2) males over 18 years of age. The Mixed Plus division shall be scored as a sub-division of the whole fleet using the competitor's actual scores.

EXPLANATION:

This new Division is to promote more women and youth in the Class. The rule will require each team to sail with two or more women crew or some combination of women and youth sailors.

6. AMENDMENT

CR Amend to Read: I.11 MIXED-PLUS EVENT

Class Rule C.3 is modified so the **crew** shall consist of 4 or more persons and contain no more than two (2) males over 18 years of age. (This Rule shall not be used to modify C.3 for Continental or World Championships.)

EXPLANATION:

This new Event Rule is to promote more women and youth in the Class. The rule will require each team to sail with two or more women crew or some combination of women and youth sailors.

7. AMENDMENT

CR Amend to Read: I.12 YOUNG CREW DIVISION

Regatta organizers will present awards for a Young Crew division. To be considered as a Young Crew team, Class Rule C.3 is modified so the entire **crew**, including the owner/driver, shall provide proof that no crew member is over 25 years of age. The Young Crew division shall be scored as a sub-division of the whole fleet using the competitor's actual scores.

EXPLANATION:

This new Division is to promote young teams.

8. AMENDMENT

CR Amend to Read: I.13 YOUNG CREW EVENT

Class Rule C.3 is modified so the entire **crew**, including the owner/driver, shall provide proof that no crew member is over 25 years of age. (This Rule shall not be used to modify C.3 for Continental or World Championships.) **EXPLANATION:**

This new Event is to promote young teams.

9. AMENDMENT

Old:

C.8 HULL APPENDAGES

C.8.1 MODIFICATIONS, MAINTENANCE AND REPAIR

(d) Modification of the keel wedges is prohibited.

Amend to Read: C.8 HULL APPENDAGES

C.8.1 MODIFICATIONS, MAINTENANCE AND REPAIR

(d) Modification of the keel wedges and their position is prohibited except as described in E2.2 (c).

EXPLANATION:

Clarify keel wedge modifications.

Now to plagiarize from Volume 10 Issue 4 because it was well written, and these items were important to repeat as we get new owners in the Class.

TECHNICAL COMMITTEE REPRESENTATIVES INVITED!

As the J/70 Class grows worldwide, we continue to expand the activities of the International Technical Committee. The Tech Committee reviews Rule changes, discusses measurement and inspection issues, and helps interpret the Rules as needed. Each National Class Association (NCA) is invited to appoint a member of the Technical Committee. Ideally, this person is familiar with measurement and inspection processes as well as the views of the local (national) J/70 Class membership. Membership on the Technical Committee is a low time commitment, with almost all the business conducted by e-mail. If your NCA would like to appoint a representative, please have the NCA President or other officer e-mail me or Chris Howell with your nomination.

BECOME A J/70 CLASS MEASURER!

We need more official J/70 Measurers. We are developing training materials that should make it easier for Class members who are interested in serving that Class in this way to become qualified, even virtually. Contact me or Chris Howell if you're interested in this!

KNOW YOUR CLASS RULES: MEASUREMENT VERSUS INSPECTION

One thing that is important to keep in mind when thinking about how the J/70 Class Rules are structured is the difference between measurement and inspection. Although we usually use those terms interchangeably in conversation and when referencing Class Rule enforcement, they are not really the same. With only a few exceptions, Class Rule enforcement

in the J/70 Class is via inspection, not measurement: we are inspecting the boats for compliance with the Class Rules, not performing fundamental measurements as defined by the Rules. The reason this is important to keep in mind is that the J/70 Class is a Manufacturer's Class, meaning that the boats are supplied only by the Licensed Manufacturers, and the Copyright Holder (J/Boats) and the Licensed Manufacturers alone determine virtually all the boats' fundamental measurements. The Class Association has, over the years, developed some inspection numbers related to aspects of the boat (especially the foils), but in almost all cases these numbers are not part of the Class Rules.

To give one example, at many events, we measure the distance between the bottom surface of the keel and the bottom surface of the hull. But that number does not exist in the Class Rules—we use that 'measurement' as an inspection tool to identify possible Class Rule violations, which are any modifications to any part of the boat that are not expressly authorized by the Class Rules. This, in turn, means two important things:

First, a boat may meet our inspection number for this keel down distance but nonetheless be in violation of the Class Rules because of impermissible modifications even if those modifications did not result in a lower keel.

Second, just because a boat is inspected to be within our numbers at one event does not mean that the boat will pass inspection at some future event. Our private internal numbers we use for inspection are undergoing constant review, based on the Technical Committee and J/70 International Measurers' experiences and observations, as well as discussions with J/Boats and the Licensed Manufacturers. These numbers can change over time as we get more information and refine our inspection tools. In addition, we develop entirely new inspection tools and parameters (numbers) every year.

Because we (mostly) enforce the Class Rules by inspections, not measurement, it is important to remember the fundamental rule of the J/70 Class Rules: do not modify the boat in any way that is not expressly authorized by a provision of the Class Rules. Put plainly, trying to optimize a boat through modifications is almost certainly going to result in the boat failing inspection at some point in the future.

LOOKING AHEAD

Members of the Technical Committee will be present at the 2023 Europeans in Weymouth, 2023 North Americans in Chicago the 2023 Worlds in St Petersburg.


